

Connecticut Resident Over 62 Tuition Waiver

Who is eligible?

- You are 62 years of age or older before the start of the term.
- You are a Connecticut resident.
- You are either:
 - Admitted to a degree program, or
 - Not in a degree program, but enrolling after the first day of classes and there is space available in the course.

What does the waiver cover?

- Fall and Spring semesters only (not Summer or Winter), with the exception of specific cohort programs.
- Credit-bearing courses only.
- Applies to undergraduate and graduate tuition.
- May apply to some fee-based graduate programs up to the cost of full-time in-state graduate tuition, including, but not limited to, programs in the Schools of Business, Nursing, and Engineering, as well as the Online Social Work program.

Note: If you are enrolled in a fee-based graduate program, you must submit a residency affidavit to the Graduate School to have your residency verified as in-state. Download the [Residency Affidavit Form](#) (PDF) and email it to graduateadmissions@uconn.edu for review.

What does the waiver not cover?

- Graduate certificate programs (if matriculated) and individual courses within those programs (if enrolled as a non-degree student).
- Audited courses. Learn about the [Senior Citizen Audit Program](#).

Important Notes

- If you receive employer tuition reimbursement, the waiver will be reduced by that amount.
- This waiver does not cover mandatory fees, books, or other costs.
- There is no formal application required each semester for the Over 62 Waiver.
